

Adverse Judicial Decisions

74. Court decisions undermining the Voting Rights Act's private right of action
75. Harsh voter registration compliance deadlines
76. Presidential undermining of the independence of the Election Assistance Commission by attempting to impose his own voter system guidelines and requiring federal voter registration form mandate passports, birth certificates and other proof of citizenship.
77. Dismantling the Voting Rights Section of the Civil Rights Division of the Department of Justice by firing attorneys, dropping cases seeking enforcement of Voting Rights Act anti-racial discrimination provision including racial gerrymandering and shifting agenda to focus on demands for voter files, voter purges and other suppressive measures.

Disenfranchisement of Specific Groups

78. Failure to accept Native American Tribal ID
79. Barring Native American voters through residential address requirements for Native American lands which have no PO Boxes
80. Failure to place polling sites on Native American lands
81. Ex-felon disenfranchisement laws
82. Failure to inform formerly incarcerated persons of their voting rights or eligibility to vote
83. Failure to accommodate voters with disabilities
84. No disability accessibility
85. Barriers to voter registration for homeless voters
86. Proof of Citizenship laws
87. Jailed persons' preconviction: denied right to register and/or vote
88. Requiring formerly incarcerated persons whose rights have been restored in the state of their offense to now pay fines, fees, and restitution prior to restoration of the right to vote in a new state to which they have moved (Jim Crow 2.0)

Barriers to Casting A Ballot

1. Long lines
2. Excessive Voter purging
3. Bans on voting by mail
4. Strict Voter Photo ID laws
5. Closing of DMV's in strict voter ID law states
6. Failure to accept government -issued state university and college student Id's
7. No early voting
8. Early Voting cuts
9. No Sunday "Souls to the Polls", early voting
10. Polling places reductions or consolidations
11. Last minute unannounced polling place relocations
12. Refusal to place polling sites on college campuses
13. Inadequate or poorly trained staffing at polls
14. Inadequate number of functioning machines optical scanners or electronic polling books
15. Running out of ballots at polling sites
16. No paper ballots
17. Lack of available public transportation to polling sites
18. Disparate racial treatment at polling sites
19. No curbside voting
20. Not enough disability accessible voting equipment
21. Barriers to voter assistance by family or others
22. "Out-of-precinct no vote" counted rules
23. Absentee Ballot short return deadlines
24. Exact match requirements for signatures or other information
25. Complicated Absentee Ballot Requirements
26. Employers not providing time off or enough time to vote
27. Failure to assist or accommodate voters displaced by natural disasters
28. Criminalizing private citizens for giving food, water, and other assistance to voters in long lines
29. Bans on dropbox/limiting the number of dropboxes/limiting the hours of access to dropbox locations to make them inaccessible before and after work
30. Criminalizing and prohibiting private groups from giving out applications for absentee or vote by mail ballots

31. Court sanctioned closure of polling locations without public notice
32. Eliminating use of voting machines at polling places
33. Banning counting of mailed ballots postmarked prior to Election Day but not received by Election Day
34. Language discrimination- failure to accommodate
35. Lack of language-accessible materials
36. Restrictions on straight-party voting

Voter Intimidation & Deceptive Practices

37. Deceptive practices- Flyers, Robocalls promoting disenfranchising disinformation
38. Voter intimidation- impersonating law enforcement personnel or immigration officers
39. Police at polling places
40. Presence of ICE at or near polling places
41. Creating polling place confusion by splitting Black precincts
42. Voter challengers at the polls
43. DOJ demanding voter records
44. Election Boards refusing to certify the election due to "Stop the Steal" myths about Dominion voting machines
